STEP #1: CALL TO GET HELP FOR YOUR CHILD

FOR KIDS WITH MEDICAL ASSISTANCE (MA) OR THE CHILDREN'S HEALTH INSURANCE PROGRAM (CHIP)

- Your Medical Assistance or CHIP plan will help you get the care your child needs such as testing your home for lead, getting the lead out of your home and getting health care services.

STEP #2: GET YOUR HOME TESTED FOR LEAD

FOR KIDS WITH MEDICAL ASSISTANCE (MA) OR THE CHILDREN'S HEALTH INSURANCE PROGRAM (CHIP)

- All Medical Assistance and some CHIP plans will pay to have a company test your home for free.
- Your child's doctor needs to contact the company and tell them your child tested positive for lead.
- You can call the company and schedule the test. Find your insurance plan below and call the number listed to schedule a test.

STEP #3: GET THE LEAD OUT OF YOUR HOME

DELAWARE COUNTY LEAD HAZARD CONTROL PROGRAM

- This is a FREE program for families with low to moderate incomes to get the lead out.
 - You may qualify if:
 - o you rent or own your home
 - o you are pregnant
 - o you have a child under six years old that lives with you or spends at least 60 hours a year in your home

HIRE A HOME LEAD REMOVAL COMPANY

CALL YOUR LOCAL WEATHERIZATION OR HOUSING REHABILITATION PROGRAM

- This Weatherization Program for homeowners and renters is not specifically for removing lead hazards in homes, but the program can remove old windows with deteriorating lead-based paint, which are a major lead hazard.
 - Community Action Agency of Delaware County Weatherization Program (610) 521-8770
- This Housing Rehabilitation Program is for low-income homeowners to do critical household repairs/ replacement for heat and hot water appliances, roofs, plumbing and electrical systems, and unsafe doors and windows, but they can also address problems that cause lead hazards and remove those hazards as part of the repair/replacement process.
